



# ELIGIBILITY FOR BURSARY FUNDING

You will be eligible to apply for this funding if:

- You are aged 16, 17 or 18 on 31st August 2018 and enrolled onto a funded course full-time or part-time attending 2 or more days over 10 or more hours per week
- You have the right to live in the UK - if you are an asylum seeker or refugee you will need to provide a copy of your Home Office letter or passport.
- You live in a household where your gross annual income for 2017/2018 is £25,000 or less.
- Continued eligibility to support is based upon 89% attendance each term.

Please note if you are enrolled onto an apprenticeship you are not eligible for any bursary support.

The college operates a Travel Support Scheme for Apprentices in conjunction with National Express\*. Please see your local Student Services for further catalls.

Funding is limited and once all funds are allocated no more applications will be accepted.

## ADDITIONAL BURSARY SUPPORT (VULNERABLE BURSARY)

The government gives the college some additional funds to support those young people who are identified as being vulnerable. You will be eligible to apply for this additional funding if you are:

- In care or have recently left care
- In receipt of Income Support or Universal Credit in your own right
- In receipt of both Employment Support Allowance or Universal Credit and Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments in your own right

Anyone falling into the above groups will be able to receive an allowance of up to £30 per week in addition to the support listed under the bursary.

## BURSARY SUPPORT AVAILABLE

#### TRAVEL (PUBLIC TRANSPORT)

Travel support is provided to support with the costs of public transport to and from college.

If you are eligible for Travel Support it will be issued to you in the form of West Midlands Travel MTickets, Swift cards or travel vouchers. For learners travelling outside of the West Midlands area monetary awards are provided.

During September students attending will be issued with a termly pass. Passes in Term 2 and 3 are subject to achieving published attendance criteria.

For learners starting outside of September support is issued based on the start/end duration of the course. Attendance criteria apply.

Free (Public Transport) Travel support is available for 16-18 year olds enrolled on a funded full time course at one of our following colleges

- James Watt
- Erdington
- Stourbridge

- Art & Design Centre
- Kidderminster Academy
- COSF

If you are enrolled at one of our other colleges you will be eligible for travel if you meet the eligibility criteria for the bursary.

#### STUDY COSTS

You may be able to get a contribution of up to 50% towards your equipment costs if you are eligible for the bursary, so if you have kits or equipment to buy for your course then you might be able to get help with the cost, you will just need to provide receipts for what you have purchased and if eligible you will be refunded up to 50% (100% for vulnerable bursary) of the cost. Support cannot be provided for any hardware equipment, for example, laptops, tablets, Macs, cameras, sewing machines etc. Please speak to the Student Services department before making a purchase to confirm that a 50% refund can be awarded.

#### **UCAS**

If you are eligible for the bursary the registration fee for your UCAS application will be refunded back to you once your application has been sent to UCAS.

#### PRINTING CREDITS

A printing credit award will be uploaded onto your account. In terms 2/3 if you meet the requirements for the bursary (including attendance) your account will be credited.

#### TRIPS AND VISITS

You may be able to receive a 50% (100% for vulnerable bursary) contribution towards the cost of course related trips and visits, so you will only pay 50% of the cost yourself. This contribution is paid directly to your course department.

## MEAL ALLOWANCE

We offer a breakfast club at our main colleges from 8am each day.

We offer two meal schemes:

## Free bursary meals

All bursary eligable learners are provided with a £2.41 meal allowance each day.

## Free college meals

Those learners are in receipt of one of the following are also eligable for an additional £2.41 per day. Total allowance £4.82 per day.

To be eligible for free meals your parents/guardians must be in receipt of one of the following

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs

#### **THE RULES**

- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit with net earnings not exceeding equivalent of £7,400 per annum

#### CARE TO LEARN

This fund has been set up to give financial support to young mothers and fathers who want to continue their education or training and need help with the cost of childcare. You can apply to Care to Learn if:

- you are under 20 at the start of your course
- you are using a registered childcare provider
- you are enrolled onto a funded course

You could also receive extra help towards your travel costs.

With any kind of funding there are always some rules. They are:

- Funding is available for one academic year. If you are on a two year course or come back next year for another course you will need to make a new application
- Any funding that is agreed will be for your current course only, if you enrol onto a new course you will be required to make a new application
- You need to be enrolled on your course before your funding starts
- You will need to maintain an acceptable attendance level to continue receiving the support throughout the year

Receiving any form of financial support is dependent on you meeting the attendance, punctuality and behaviour expected of you. If you are having any problems then you should speak to your personal tutor straight away.

#### **OUR PART OF THE DEAL**

Once we've got your fully completed application we'll let you know the outcome within a maximum of 10 working days. Applications for travel support and meal allowance will be given priority assessment.

We'll also inform you within this time frame if you do not qualify for any additional help.

If you are not happy with your award, the first step is to contact the Student Services team. They will check the award and make sure that you have received everything that you are entitled to and will explain how the application has been assessed.

If you are still unhappy with the award, you should write a letter of appeal to the Student Finance Team Leader. The appeal must be made in within 14 days of the date of the original decision; the Student Finance Team Leader will respond to the appeal within 10 working days.

We have a duty to make sure that the funds are awarded fairly and to the students most in need.

#### FRAUDULENT CLAIMS

We ask for detailed information and may invite applicants for interview so that we can distribute our funds fairly. If a claim is considered to be fraudulent we will ask for any money awarded to be repaid in full and may take court action.
