Duration:

It is anticipated that the course is completed in 3-6 months.

Course content

This qualification is an introduction to the knowledge and understanding needed to work in a school or college environment. It can apply to the many varied roles that full and part-time support staff may fulfil including: administrative roles, site support roles, technical roles and volunteers, as well as roles that work directly with children and young people in the learning environment.

The qualification is aimed at people who are thinking of working in a school or college setting.

To achieve the Award you must complete 6 mandatory units:

- Understand Schools and Colleges as an Organisation
- Understand Children and Young People's Development
- Understand Communication and Professional Relationships with Children, Young People and Adults.
- Understand Children and Young People's Health and Safety.
- Safeguarding Children and Young People.
- Understand Equality, Diversity and Inclusion in Work with Children and Young People.

All units will be internally assessed using a range of methods, which could include written assignments or tasks such as designing a leaflet or booklet, charts or diagrams. All assessments will be submitted electronically to a course tutor and you will receive feedback on these assessments within two working weeks.

Entry and Eligibility Requirements

You will need motivation and willingness to learn. Applicants will be required to complete an initial assessment of minimum Entry Level 3 English and Mathematics. Applicants will need to be unemployed and provide proof of benefits in order to be assessed for full fee remission.
