## **Big Bang**

The importance of Science,
Technology, Engineering and
Mathematics (STEM) is integral to
the UK's success. The UK is the sixth
biggest economy in the world. Whilst
we make up only 1% of the world's
population, we produce 10% of the
world's top scientific research.

STEM education is a major priority for schools, and this event will enable pupils to take part in a host of activities to give them a greater understanding in the applications of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.

This event includes many practical workshops and will help pupils recognise how the science, design & technology, computer science, engineering and mathematics studied at school can lead to rich and varied career pathways.

## Big Bang workshops may consist of:

- Micro Biological Horrors avoiding these in your everyday environment could save your life.
- Glitter Bug you call that washing your hands? Investigate the bacteria found on your hands and use UV light to see how good/bad you are at washing them off!
- Imitation Game learn cryptography techniques and solve cypher challenges.

- Balloon Kebabs can you pierce a balloon with a wooden skewer without popping it and explain how it works?
- Pop Rockets make your own mini rockets.
- Non Newtonian Fluids a liquid that behaves like a solid whilst still being a liquid.

## Aspire to Be

Choosing a career is one of the most important decisions a young person will make in their lives. We live in a world that is constantly demanding change and flexibility. Where some occupations are becoming defunct, others are growing and being created, with a demand for new and innovative skills. It is important that we support young people to think carefully about the career choices they make, by providing relevant information and an insight in to the different careers that they can choose. More importantly, we must support them to choose qualifications and pathways that give them the flexibility that employers require in an ever changing labour market. During the Aspire to Be days, students will be able to partake in practical workshops which will give them an insight into different career pathways.



BMet offers a wide range of courses for students who need extra support to learn, who need to enhance their skills before moving up a level, or who have a learning difficulty. All courses offer progression routes onto higher level qualifications, employment or voluntary work.

Foundation learning is the name given to courses at entry level and level 1 and offer an opportunity for students to continue their education at their own pace. Our foundation learning taster events are aimed at students who have a learning difficulty and those learners who are predicted GCSE grades 3 and under. This event will give students an insight into college life and a taster of the foundation learning course, sessions will include fun team building activities as well as exploring essential life living skills.

Students can now apply online and book a time to come and see us through our new online feature. Save time by picking an appointment slot that suits!


Terms and conditions apply: some courses are excluded from online appointment booking. Where online booking is not available, applicants will be contacted by admissions with an appointment date/time.

## **FREE Travel Support**

Students (16 – 18 year olds) can take advantage of FREE travel on public transport when studying at James Watt College and Erdington Skills Centre. This will give them unlimited bus travel across Birmingham and the West Midlands, which they can use not only to get to college but also to visit friends at weekends and much more.

Passes are awarded termly. They must be 16-18 years old, and studying a full-time course to qualify for their first pass. The college will renew their pass if they maintain a good attendance record\*.


