

BSc (Hons) Degree Podiatry Values Based Interview Day (9.00 am start)

We are delighted that you have chosen to apply for the BSc (Hons) Degree Podiatry course.

Morning activities

Activity 1

Be prepared to talk about the topic 'what does compassion mean to you?' for approximately 15 minutes. To enable you to do this we would like you to bring with you an item/object to help demonstrate your explanation.

Activity 2

Following a comfort break you will then be given a topic which you will discuss as part of a group. You will be observed during this group discussion and graded accordingly.

Afternoon activities

Interview Session

Individual interviews will be held during the afternoon and you will be allocated a time slot on the day. This will involve a face to face interview with two members of the Podiatry team.

You are expected to provide a five minute PowerPoint presentation on the topic 'Why Podiatry?' Please bring this on the day, on a memory stick, and also email a copy to esther.sabin@bmet.ac.uk no later than 5 pm the day before your interview.

Assessments

You will be required to undertake a 30 minute free writing assessment during the afternoon and you will be allocated a time slot on the day.

How to prepare for your values based interview day

Please ensure you bring the following documentation with you to the interview:

- Original Certificate or Results Slip or Transcript, if already obtained, as evidence of:
 - Degree Level Certificate (if applicable)
 - Level 3 and above qualifications (for example, A Level, BTEC Extended Diploma, HNC/D and Access to HE Diploma)
 - Level 2 English Language or Literacy (for example, GCSE)
 - Level 2 Mathematics or Numeracy (for example, GCSE)
- Evidence of Proof of Identity - a valid passport or photo driving license.
- An item/object for Activity 1.
- Your five minute PowerPoint presentation on a memory stick.

Finance information
