

Foundation Degree Dental Technology Interview

We are delighted that you have chosen to apply for the Foundation Degree Dental Technology course.

Morning activities

Initial Assessments

You will be asked to complete an English and Maths initial assessment to determine your current level in these subjects.

Free Writing Exercise

You will be asked to complete a free writing exercise to assess the level of your written English. It is expected to last about 30 minutes.

You will break for lunch (please make your own arrangements for lunch provisions. Canteen facilities are available on site).

Afternoon activities

Interview

During your 30 minute interview we want to find out more about you, your interests and hobbies as well as discussing your future career aspirations.

Presentation

You are expected to provide a five minute presentation on the topic 'How I will prepare for the Foundation Degree Dental Technology course'. The presentation can be given using PowerPoint or by providing a professional hand out which details the information you have covered.

The presentation should include the following topics:

- Financial support
- Emotional and well-being support
- Travel
- Accommodation
- Approaches to studying

You may want to consider answers to the following questions within your presentation:

- How will you support yourself financially during the duration of the course?
- How long will it take you and how will you get to and from college and placements?
- Will you be living away from home and how will you cope with this?
- How do you plan to manage the large amount of self-directed study that is required?

During the presentation we will be assessing for:

- Ability to follow instructions
- Visual and verbal clarity
- Communication skills
- All topics are covered

Please bring your presentation on the day on a memory stick and also email a copy to headmissions@bmet.ac.uk no later than 5 pm the day before your interview.

Manual Dexterity Test

You will be asked to perform a basic manual dexterity test so we can assess your hand eye co-ordination. This will take about 20 minutes and you could be asked to either draw an object or carry out a basic wax carving exercise.

We will supply the materials so that you can complete this test.

You will be allocated a time slot for your interview, presentation and manual dexterity test on the day.

How to prepare for your interview day

Please ensure you bring the following documentation with you to the interview:

- Original Certificate or Results Slip or Transcript, if already obtained, as evidence of:
 - Degree Level Certificate (if applicable)
 - Level 3 and above qualifications (for example, A Level, BTEC Extended Diploma, HNC/D and Access to HE Diploma)
 - Level 2 English Language or Literacy (for example, GCSE)
 - Level 2 Mathematics or Numeracy (for example, GCSE)
- Evidence of Proof of Identity - a valid passport or photo driving license.
- Your five minute presentation on a memory stick.
